

Hosanna, The Chosen

Mark 11:9 — Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, "Hosanna!"

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

I get my hosannas and halleluiahs mixed up. Halleluiah is for praise songs and worship. Hosanna is for palm branches. Yes, two different things.

Halleluiah praises God for all He has done; it's a Revelation word, what the elders say as they praise the Lord in Heaven; what we say when we praise the Lord in worship.

Hosanna praises God for bringing the Messiah, it means, "Lord, save us we pray." It was shouted while waving palm branches, a symbol of the Lord's Army, a military image, and it quotes Psalm 118:25 -- O Lord, save us, and grant us success. Blessed is he who come in the name of the Lord, from the house of the Lord, we bless you.

Both are good praise-y words, both are almost interchangeable, but each is used specifically.

I don't worry if I say Hosanna when I mean Halleluiah or Visa when I mean Versa. Still, it is nice to know that each has specific purpose and each rather transcends language -- I suspect that Halleluiah in English is much the same word in German or Chinese or Zulu. (I could be wrong, but I don't think so.). I also consider the H-less spelling -- Alleluia -- the same, although if I am wrong, I do apologize.

Still, Hosanna is a good word to shout to King Jesus (focus of our One-King rallies) and

Halleluiah is a good word to sing to our Lord Jesus, our Savior.

And I cannot help but sing the camp song that college roommate Roger taught me nearly 50 years ago:

Ho-Ho-Ho Hosanna Ha-Ha-Ha-leluiah He-He-He saves me I've got the joy of the Lord in me.

Hosanna, or Halleluiah, or even Hosuliah or Hallanna, serve the same purpose for me:

Praise the Lord, who saves us. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Thank you,

Jesus. Let's do church!
